

# REPORT ON THE EDUCATION AFRICA 5TH INTERNATIONAL MARIMBA AND STEELPAN FESTIVAL 2016 BUILDING A BETTER AFRICA AND A BETTER WORLD

243 performances; 65 fringe events and over 1900 participants in this amazing event! The largest festival of its kind in the world!

Education Africa in partnership with Tom Newby School in Benoni and in association with the High Commission of Trinidad and Tobago was the host of this prestigious event. We were blessed to have the continuing sponsorship from The Department of Arts and Culture. #### TRIBUTES

However, the engine that drives this festival is the marimba teacher! There were many in attendance...in fact nearly 200 marimba teachers! These are the unsung heroes of the festival. These are the dedicated teachers who coached and trained their bands and made sure that they were ready for their performances. Thank you from the bottom of my heart for all you are doing for our youth wherever you are! You are special and deserved to be recognized in your communities for your unwavering passion! In honour of these teachers the **Zulu Nyala Heritage Lodge** in Hluhluwe sponsored a weekend away for two. The winner, who was drawn out of a hat,

was **Adele Pullen** from **MC Kharbai** in Lenasia. Thank you to Zulu Nyala for their kindness and support of the festival!

Each year we pay tribute to the school that travelled the furthest to the Festival and this year it went to **Kleinmond Laerskool** in the Cape who beat Heideveld Senior Secondary School by 1 kilometre!

Motheong Primary School from Atteridgeville won the prize for the school who brought the largest contingent to the festival: 97 people! The following schools were close on their heels: Redhill with 91; Kingsmead with 87; St Benedict's with 70; Merrifield with 60 and Curro Thatchfield with 54! Thank you for your support and thank you must also go to all the schools large or small who made the special effort to get to the festival!

This Festival is known for its special spirit! This has become the magical ingredient that sets us apart from all other festivals of this kind around the world!

#### SOCIAL COHESION AND PARTNERSHIP WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF ARTS AND CULTURE

Our theme for this year was BUILDING A BETTER AFRICA AND A BETTER WORLD the theme of the Department of Arts and Culture for Africa Month. **Social Cohesion** is uppermost in our minds at Education Africa when planning this festival as we firmly believe that the teachers of our country are going to change perceptions and heal wounds and facilitate integration and tolerance in our beautiful country and it is through music, the universal language, that we can achieve this ideal in a very real way. Anyone attending the festival would know that we made major inroads into achieving this goal. This was evident not only in the spirit of the festival but also at all the workshops and at the massed marimba performance.



The International Marimba and Steelpan Festival is fully inclusive and we had a few mentally and physically challenged bands competing alongside their able-bodied counterparts. We were so very proud of their achievements, too!

#### DEPARTMENT OF ARTS AND CULTURE SPONSORSHIP

Through the vision and generosity of the Department of Arts and Culture we were able to sponsor over 500 people from under-resourced bands and communities to attend this festival. This sponsorship covered meals, transport, accommodation and entry fees.

## THE FESTIVAL

Marimbas and steelpans started arriving at the festival from early Friday 29 July. The massive marquee in the beautiful grounds of Tom Newby soon filled up with marimbas and steelpans from all over Southern Africa.



By the time the festival started at 8am on Saturday morning there were over 250 marimbas and steelpans on the floor!

## PARTICIPATION

Participants from six of our nine provinces of South Africa as well as Swaziland, Zimbabwe, and Botswana attended. In addition we had 6 adjudicators: 3 from South Africa and one each from Australia, France and the USA. 76 Institutions participated in 243 competition entries!



The festival has two main components: THE MAIN event and the FRINGE events.

## MAIN EVENT

At the main event in the marquee, marimba and steelpan competitions took place throughout the two days where bands in different sections and age categories competed for the much coveted trophies and many, many prizes.

Our 6 adjudicators were put in 2 teams and alternated between adjudicating and giving lecturedemonstrations and performances. This allowed the participants the opportunity to experience the calibre of the adjudicators and created a renewed respect for them!

The six esteemed adjudicators were Andy Narell from France, Gerard van de Geer from Australia, Hallie Blejewski from USA, Dr Andile Khumalo from Gauteng, Bongani Sotshononda from Cape Town and Pops Mohamed from Gauteng.



**Andy Narell** is one of our patrons and also a special friend of the Festival. Andy is a steelpan performer who performs worldwide and was able to demonstrate to the public what a great musician and teacher he is through his performances on the Fringe.



**Gerard van de Geer** is an inspiring marimba teacher from Hobart, Tasmania. He is also an Orff Specialist and gives workshops throughout the world on best practice in Orff Schulwerk. His workshops for teachers were very popular and enjoyed by all who attended.



**Hallie Blejewski** is a steelpan teacher from Connecticut in New York. She is busy reading for her PHD and was at the festival as part of her research. She gave introductory lessons to teachers on starting out on the steelpan!



**Dr. Andile Khumalo** is a lecturer of composition at the Wits School of Music. In addition to being one of the composition adjudicators he also gave workshops on improvisation. His positive energy towards all the performers put them at ease.



**Bongani Sotshononda** is a marimba performer and comes from Cape Town. His knowledge of all things relating to marimba made him a perfect adjudicator for this festival. He gave workshops at the Fringe on introducing Jazz on the marimba.



**Pops Mohamed**, our very own National Treasure, completed our line-up of adjudicators. Pops is not only a performer on various African instruments but also a composer and fountain of knowledge on all matters to do with African music and culture. He performed twice with Dave Reynolds on the fringe.

## THE FRINGE EVENTS

The Fringe events have become an integral part of the festival with people queuing for the possibility of getting into a marimba or djembe workshop. There were also a number of **open workshops** which were part of the fringe events: these included gumboot dancing by **Durban Prep High School** in KZN; Tswana and Khoisan dancing by **Pinky Ramagole**; Indian dancing by **Rashika Naidoo**; Flamenco dancing by **Roseanne Maile**; steelpan workshops by **Dave Reynolds**; concerts by **Dave Reynolds and Pops Mohamed** and concerts by **Andy Narell**, the massed djembe event by members of PACD and the massed marimba event given by **Joan Lithgow**.

In addition there were a number of workshops that required the public to book for. These included marimbas workshops at various levels given by **Michael Sibanda** and **Patience Musandirire** and djembe workshops given by **members of the PACD.** In addition there were mbira workshops by **Chris Timbe**; the various workshops as mentioned above by the adjudicators; The **SAMRO** commissioned work: **NYALA** composed by **BONGANI SOTSHONONDA** for steelpan, chromatic marimba and a chromatic bass marimba has added a new combination of instruments to the world music repertoire. Thank you to the **SAMRO FOUNDATION** for commissioning this work for our Festival. Thank you to the performers of this work: **Dave Reynolds** on pans, **Bongani Sotshononda** on chromatic marimba and **Bradley Lithgow** on chromatic bass marimba.



One of the highlights of the Festival was the massed marimba and steelpan experience where a composition entitled: **AFRICA**, **MY AFRICA**, composed by **Joan Lithgow** for the Festival to celebrate the theme of the festival: BUILDING A BETTER AFRICA AND A BETTER WORLD, was taught by the composer to all participants en masse in 40 minutes! In addition, Reynette Cerff from Grens HS in East London taught the piece to a choir and the marimbas and steelpans and choir then joined forces in a rendition of this celebratory piece.





#### SAMRO CONTRIBUTION

In addition to the competitions that were playing out in the Marquee there was also a COMPOSITION COMPETITION in three age categories that was fully sponsored by **THE SAMRO FOUNDATION**. The erudite adjudicators for this competition were: **Andy Narell, Dave Reynolds** and **Andile Khumalo**.

There were only 3 entries in total received: 1 entry in the adult section and 2 in the school-going section. The adjudicators were impressed with the standard of the compositions. The winners were: **Ian Holloway** in the adult section and **Nicholas Leisegang** in the school section. These compositions were judged "blind" so the adjudicators had no idea who they were judging!
